

Sermon Outline:

Discover the Fullness of Life in Christ-Part 3 - PRAYER

Question: What is the role of prayer in a disciple's knowledge of God and how can a disciple effectively pray?

Prayer is a transparent dialogue. It is a conversation with God whereby we address Him and in quiet are addressed by Him.

Four of the facets of prayer: They are summarized by the acronym ACTS.

Adoration - worshipping God for who He is apart from what He has done for us. Hebrews 13:15

Confession - acknowledging to God our sin and receiving forgiveness. I John 1:9

Thanksgiving - expressing to God our gratefulness for all He has done for us. Psalm 100:4

Supplication - interceding to God for ourselves and others. James 4:2,3; Philippians 4:6

Prayer is a relationship with God

How we perceive our parents affects our perception of god

How we responded to our parents affects our response to God

Prayer is a partnership with God - Revelation 8
