Our Church News

Today in our pulpit, Tim Roggatz - I was born in Minnesota, attended Lutheran schools and received B.A. in Communications from Adrian College. Karen was raised in Hesperia and Fremont. We have been married for 31 years and have served in different capacities at several churches, most recently at Lakeshore Fellowship in Ferrysburg. I learned my love of music and the Lord from my parents. Karen and I serve together as often as possible in church choirs, small musical groups. We have two sons; the oldest lives in Wisconsin and the youngest is in Heaven celebrating with other family members. My work experience has taken me through manufacturing industries and food-service including working as a cook at Brew Works. In our pulpit December 29 and January 5 - Rev. Mark L.
